

FACULTY QUALIFICATIONS FOR ENTREPRENEURSHIP

Significant experience in a related field may substitute for all or part of the 18 hours. In exceptional cases, significant entrepreneurial experience in the profit or not-for-profit sector may substitute for the academic preparation in (1) or (2) above.
